

Halifax martial arts show debuts on RadX

Halifax-shot mixed martial arts TV series Cubicle to the Cage premieres Thursday at 11 p.m. on RadX.

Produced by Hemmings House Pictures Ltd., Cubicle to the Cage follows a group of average people, including students, a dentist, a nurse, a barista and more, as they train for more than a year to fight professionally in the cage.

Boyd Sharpe, who came up with the idea for the series in which he is one of the featured fighters, says in a news release, "This series is not only for fans of MMA, it is for fans of transformational storytelling. While Cubicle to the Cage does tell the stories of a group of people trying to become professional fighters, the story is really about the tenacity, determination and intestinal fortitude required to achieve your goals, in any realm.
