

Halifax-area entrepreneurs picked for leadership program

Two Halifax-area entrepreneurs have been selected for a leadership development program at the Wallace McCain Institute in Fredericton.

Colin Gillis of Halifax's **IPECC Project Management Inc.** and Lesley Steele of **Vet Alliance Inc.** in Eastern Passage are among 16 businesspeople from Atlantic Canada who will take part in an entrepreneurial leaders program.

Gillis is principal of business development, marketing and human resources with IPECC, while Steele is a veterinarian and owner and president of Vet Alliance.

Participants, chosen for their high-growth potential, were among 418 nominations received by the institute, based at the University of New Brunswick.

The program, in its seventh year, allows entrepreneurs to meet twice per month for a year in a setting that includes speakers and peer interaction.
